Storm King Art Center Archives

Access Policy

Permission to publish, quote, or reproduce must be secured from the repository and the copyright holder.

The collection is open for research use. The Archives will make research materials in its possession available to legitimate researchers with legitimate justification, but with the following stipulations:

1. Inventories, relevant files and the assistance of a staff member or trained volunteer shall be available to users.
2. A registration form listing rules for usage will be read, filled out and signed by all researchers.
3. Items must be handled on-site; no archival materials may be removed from the premises without the special permission of the Director.
4. The Archives may limit the use of fragile or unusually valuable materials.
5. Hours of operation may be by designated hours or by appointment, depending on the availability of staff or trained volunteers.
6. Reproduction:
 - a. A Request for Copies form containing a notice of copyright restriction shall be signed by each user before copies are made.
 - b. Copies may not be used "for any purpose other than private study, scholarship or research." (United States Copyright Law, Title 17)
 - c. Reproduction by the Archives in no way transfers either copyright or property rights, nor does it constitute permission to publish or display materials.
 - d. All prices for copying shall be determined by the Archives.
 - e. In some cases, the Archives may refuse to allow copies to be made because of the physical condition of the materials, restrictions imposed by the donor, copyright law, or right-to-privacy statutes.
7. A fee may be charged for research work done to meet requests; the amount shall be set by the Archives.
8. The Archives may refuse access to an individual researcher who has demonstrated such carelessness or deliberate destructiveness as to endanger the safety of the materials.
9. In addition, the Archives is committed to bringing to the public information culled from its documents, photographs, artifacts and oral histories.

Abstract:

Polaroid photographs and note cards taken by Ralph E. Ogden during his visits to David Smith's studio in Bolton Landing, NY between 1966 and 1967. Ogden's purchase of thirteen Smith sculptures on March 13, 1967 launched Storm King Art Center's focus as an outdoor sculpture center.

Administrative/Biographical History:

Ralph E. Ogden, known as Ted, was born in 1895 in Brooklyn, NY. After graduating from Yale University in 1916 with a degree in engineering, Ogden entered the family business, the Star Expansion Company, which manufactured fasteners for construction. Following the stock market crash in 1929, Ogden moved his family to Mountainville, NY, where he commuted to the factory headquarters in New Jersey and raised dairy cattle on his property. In 1947, Ogden founded the Ralph E. Ogden Foundation, Inc. for philanthropic projects. Upon the death of New York City attorney Vermont Hatch (1893-1959), Ogden purchased the Hatch mansion and twenty-three acres of adjoining land in Mountainville. In 1960, Ogden and H. Peter Stern, his son-in-law and business partner, opened Storm King Art Center. In 1967, Ogden purchased thirteen of David Smith's (1906-1965) sculptures after visiting the artist's studio in Bolton Landing, NY. The acquisition of Smith's works was instrumental in shifting Storm King's primary mission, leading Ogden to focus his collecting efforts specifically on outdoor sculpture. Ogden passed away at 79 years old in 1974, his legacy at Storm King Art Center firmly established.

Scope and Content:

This collection spans the period between Ogden's first visit to Bolton Landing on October 24, 1966 and his final visit on March 13, 1967. In addition to the photographs there are five sets of notes. The photographs and notes document the thirteen David Smith sculptures that Ogden purchased.
