GIFFORD BEAL


1879-1956

GIFFORD BEAL was born in New York City. While at Princeton University, from which he was graduated in 1900, he spent his summers at Shinnecock Hills, Long Island studying with William Merritt Chase, and later in New York with DuMond and Ranger. In 1908 he married Maud Ramsdell and made his only visit to Europe, where they spent their honeymoon.


The Beals lived in New York, but spent summers and several winters in Newburgh from 1913 to 1920. Mr. and Mrs. Beal and their two sons William and Gifford, Jr. then spent a summer in Maine and several in Provincetown, but from 1923 all were spent in Rockport, Mass.

Painter, watercolorist and printmaker, his work covered a wide range of subject matter. Among his watercolors were subjects done during visits to islands in the Carribean.

Gifford Beal was a member of the National Academy of Design, and was president of the Art Students' League from 1914 to 1929. He is represented in many museums throughout the country, and was awarded prizes and honors from the time of the St. Louis Exposition in 1904 to the Edwin Palmer Memorial prize in 1955. He had one-man exhibitions at the Kraushaar Galleries at intervals from 1920 to 1956 as well as in Museums and Art Centers. He died in New York in 1956.




