**The Storm King Art Center** is unique among the museums in the Hudson River Valley for its growing collection of large scale sculpture by contemporary artists. More than sixty works may be seen in extensive gardens surrounding the art center and overlooking the Hudson Highlands. Outstanding in the Storm King collection are thirteen large outdoor sculptures by David Smith. These works by Smith form a splendid nucleus for many other important sculptures such as work by Mark di Suvero, Sorel Etrog, Barbara Hepworth, Sol Lewitt, Alexander Liberman, George Rickey, Henry Moore, Isaac Witkin, Anthony Caro, Fritz Wotruba, David Von Schlegell, Max Bill, David Annesley, Joseph Konzal, Forrest Myers, Chuck Ginnever, and others.

During the year, the Storm King Art Center presents special exhibitions of paintings, graphics and sculpture in the galleries in the main building.

The museum and its surrounding gardens were first opened in 1959. The development of the collection and the sculpture garden are made possible through grants from the Ralph E. Ogden Foundation and through private donation.
