In the 200 acre sculpture gardens, "SCULPTURE IN THE FIELDS" will begin its second season. This exhibition is partially funded by The National Endowment for the Arts, Washington, D.C. Last year over 70 large-scale works were installed, and from 30 to 50 more will be added in 1974.

The art center will reopen for the 1974 art season on Saturday, April 6, and is open daily except Monday from 2 to 5:30. When Monday is a holiday, the art center is open and closed instead on Tuesday. From NYC take NY Thruway to Harriman, Exit 16; route 32 11 miles to bridge over Moodna Creek, immediate left hand road off bridge (Orrs Mill Road), 4/10 mile to sign on left.

From Westchester and Conn. Route 84, cross Newburgh bridge, take 1st exit off bridge, left at light on Rt 9W south for 6 miles to exit route 307, left on 307,  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile to bear right on route 32 North, cross bridge over Moodna Creek (see above). From Newburgh, take Route 32 6 miles to Moodna Creek bridge, take 1st immediate right hand road (Orr's Mill Road) before bridge; DO NOT CROSS BRIDGE.
